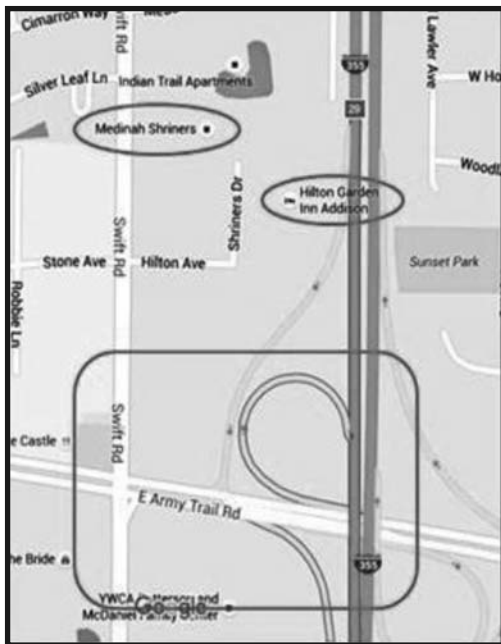

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

If you have not already done so, it is not too late to make your plans to attend “The Antique Radio Event of the Summer”. Your ARCI club officers and *Radiofest 2017* volunteers are hard at work to make *Radiofest 2017* a truly memorable experience. Registrations are running well ahead of last year. It looks like turnout is going to be really strong, so you do not want to miss out! We are also really enthusiastic about returning to the Medinah Shriners venue. Their large, separate swap meet lot is directly adjacent to an equally large parking lot for *Radiofest* attendees. There is plenty of room for both buyers and sellers! The Shriners’ banquet facility is first-rate, with a huge ballroom for our auction and banquet, and plenty of additional space for our programs and displays. Please find the latest updated information about *Radiofest 2017* throughout this issue of ARCI News.

AUCTION...Registration for the *Radiofest* auction on Friday evening, August 4, opens officially at 3:30 PM, but we will make every effort to open up as early as possible, once our auction volunteers have completed their setup. We strongly urge you to arrive early to avoid long lines and delays at the registration desk. The auction is always a very popular event, and the registration lines get longer as the afternoon goes on. Your patience and understanding are always appreciated. All items for auction must come through the main entrance of the Shriners’ facility. There is a driveway directly in front of the entrance where you can park temporarily to drop off your items. We want to avoid vehicles blocking the entrance, so we ask that you immediately move your vehicle to the parking lot before taking your items to the ballroom. The Crescent Ballroom entrance is located straight across from the outside entrance to the facility.. We strongly suggest you bring a hand truck or cart with you, especially if you are transporting large or heavy items. There will also be some carts available, but expect these to be in “heavy rotation”. Parking for auction attendees will be in the parking lot directly in front of the facility. Ample parking will be available. Please also note that only sellers with permits to park in the swap meet lot will be allowed to park there during the auction. The swap meet lot will not be available for general parking at any time during *Radiofest*.

HOTEL ROOMS...The Hilton Garden Inn informs us that a small number of rooms are still available for Friday and Saturday night at the special ARCI rate. But we do expect to completely sell out the entire room block. If you have not made reservations yet, please do so as soon as possible. In the event the Hilton is completely full, the closest alternate hotels to the Hilton Garden Inn are:

FOOD & DRINKS...We are working closely with the Shriners catering department to provide a selection of food and drinks for purchase during both the auction and the swap meet. Details are still being worked out as of this writing. In addition, the nearby Hilton Garden Inn restaurant will be open for breakfast, lunch and dinner, on all days, with extended lunch hours on Saturday. A list of restaurants in the vicinity of the Shriners facility will also be available at the *Radiofest* registration table.

NO ELECTRONICS DISPOSAL...*Radiofest* attendees cannot dispose of electronics onsite. The Illinois EPA has substantially tightened the rules regarding disposal of electronics items in state landfills. We are required to keep regular trash and electronic waste separate at the meet. This means no electronics may be placed in our trash container. A separate area for electronic items will be provided. Due to cost and size constraints, we will be required to place limits on items that are placed in the disposal/donation auction area. The main purpose will be for disposal of items that did not sell in the donation auction. We therefore ask for your cooperation on the following: Do not use our recycling area at *Radiofest* for any electronics you simply intend to throw away. We cannot accommodate such items and they should not be brought to *Radiofest*. Items to be placed in our donation auction should have a reasonable possibility of being useful to another collector. In other words, please exercise discretion when placing items in the auction pile. If you do not believe anyone will really want it, then please do not put it in the auction. We will be monitoring the donation auction area carefully, and ARCI does reserve the right to reject any item that we do not deem acceptable for the donation auction. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in this important matter.

TENT STAKES ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED...Just a friendly reminder: Our agreement with the Medinah Shriners strongly stipulates that no tent stakes will be used in the swap meet lot. This rule will be strictly enforced by ARCI.

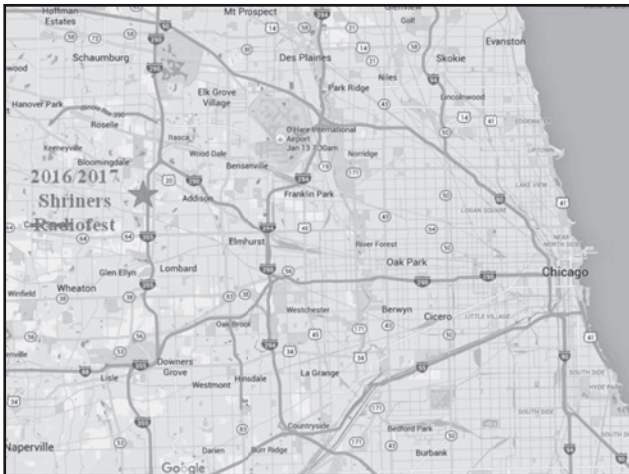

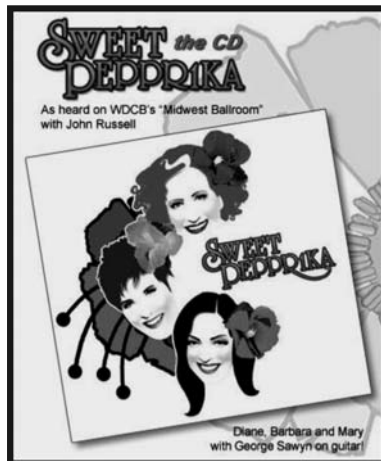


PLANS UNDERWAY FOR VINTAGE HAM STATION AT RADIOFEST

An Occasional Column About Topics Of Interest

THEY “TOOK HIM FOR A RIDE” THE FERRO & GOSSETT RADIO COMPANIES OF BELVIDERE, IL

In mid-winter of 1921, the city of Belvidere was excited. A new Chicago-based company, The Ferro Manufacturing Co. of 2011 Michigan Ave., was doing a successful business making auto specialties, telephone wires and switches, and it was looking for someplace to expand outside the hustle and bustle of the windy city. A group of Ferro executives were visiting Belvidere to see if such a location was available. They found one—on Columbia Avenue, close to the Chicago and Northwestern railroad and the Elgin and Belvidere trolley line. These rail and trolley lines connected Chicago to Belvidere and Rockford, making commutes easy for their employees and Chicago executives, and making transportation of necessary raw materials inexpensive.

Land was purchased, contracts were signed, and construction started on the 12,500 square foot plant. A city-wide celebration was held in early October since the factory was nearly completed. Many employees were already hired, and the Belvidere bigwigs were patting themselves on the back for landing this \$60,000 fish.

Production had barely started when President Carmen Ferro announced that he had “too many interests in Chicago.” He resigned from Ferro’s top spot, though he did remain the Vice President and continued to be a major stockholder. A. Pineau and Charles Turner followed in rapid succession as Presidents, which raised some questions about the company’s stability.

No matter, as Ferro continued to make Christmas light strings, wiring harnesses for Ford Model T's, and an assortment of auto accessories. Meanwhile, a relative of the company's directors met Rudolph Graf of Rockford. Mr. Graf had a keen knowledge of radio. He was a naval radio operator, receiving an Ensign's commission during WWI. He was also an excellent machinist at Barber-Colman in Rockford, thanks to his meticulous attention to detail and nearly obsessive-compulsive personality. Graf convinced Ferro Manufacturing Co. to start making radios of his design. Soon, Graf became a Ferro stockholder and Chief Engineer. The company introduced its first radio to the public at the February, 1922 Belvidere Industrial Show.

The company continued to manufacture radios and auto accessories but added a new, somewhat unusual product—corset stays. Rudolph Graf's friend had an interest in his family's company, the Gossard Corset Co. It was not a big leap from wire making to drawing and stamping corset stays—and millions of them were needed each year to supply Gossard's plants in Belvidere and Dixon. In February 1925, with Carmen Ferro by now a minor player, the Board of Directors voted to change the company's name to the Gossard Radio and Wire Corp.

Toward the end of 1926, the company decided that a completely new line of radios was needed to stimulate sales and to broaden their market coverage. Rudolph Graf set about doing all the design work, from the circuit to the new machines, and he designed the assembly lines to build this new radio.

Sadly, the strain was too much for Graf to handle. He suffered a nervous breakdown and resigned from his job at Gossard on January 1, 1927. He moved in with his sister in Rockford and attempted to heal himself, mostly by taking long walks, alone, at night. This treatment was woefully ineffective, and the 30 year old Graf jumped under the wheels of a moving freight train the night of January 23.

Rudolph Graf's gruesome suicide effectively halted any progress of the Gossard Radio and Wire Co. since he alone comprised the company's engineering department. The company struggled on its own for a while.



But, remember Carmen Ferro, the founder of this ill-fated company? He was the man who had “too many interests in Chicago” to continue as Ferro’s president. It turns out his main interest in Chicago was not making automotive accessories, but bootlegging. On November 28, 1927, Carmen Ferro was “taken for a ride” and shot through his heart, Mafia-style, on a deserted road near Bensenville.

With the major players either dead or having lost interest in radio manufacture, the Gossard Radio and Wire Co. went out of business. Its assets were liquidated at a creditors’ sale on February 26, 1929. The building remained empty through the Depression until it was purchased by the Belvidere Vitreous Enamel Corp. in December, 1935.

The following photograph shows a Gossard “All-Season” radio that resides in the Boone County Historical Museum. The photo on top of the radio is the Gossard booth from a Belvidere Manufacturers’ Expo; year unknown. It is the only example of a Ferro or Gossard radio the author knows of.
