

# REGISTER EARLY FOR JUNE HAMFEST COMBINED MEET WITH SIX METER CLUB

The June ARCI swap meet will be a joint event with the Six Meter Club of Chicago on Sunday, June 19, 2016 at the DuPage County Fairgrounds, 2015 Manchester Rd., in Wheaton - just a bit south and west of our ARCI meets at the American Legion in Carol Stream. Last year more than 1,200 radio enthusiasts and hams from 16 states and with visitors from Canada and Mexico participated in the giant flea market and other events, including many ARCI members who were able to park in a special area designated as ARCI Swap Row.

We will have displays from AMSAT, ARRL, NWS/Skywarn and dealer displays. And, the Midwest Classic Radio Net's *Hamboree* will be back with us again. MCRN is a gathering of hams that operate "boat anchor" equipment on a weekly 3885 kHz AM net.





Everyone MUST have a Hamfest ticket to attend. Tickets are still only \$6 in advance, or \$8 at the gate. There is no charge for outdoor flea market space - please see the registration form for information. As usual, ARCI will have its donation auction at 10 am along with the 50-50 drawing. In addition, if you deposit your Hamfest ticket stubs in the drum near the stage in Building 2, you have a chance to win many other prizes including \$300, \$200 and \$100 cash.

Indoor flea market sellers and commercial dealers will be in Buildings 2, 3 and 4 with the outdoor flea market to the east of the Exhibition Hall building and extending north along the east side of the fairgrounds. All traffic will enter and exit through gate S-7 located east of the main exhibition hall. For ham operators, station K9ONA will be on the air, serving as a talk-in station on two meter FM, 146.52 simplex and through the 146.37/97 repeater (107.2 Hz tone). Food, coffee and soda will be available from the Romeoville Knights of Columbus.

For anyone wishing to take an FCC Amateur Radio license exam, testing will be held from 9 to 11 am.

The Hamfest opens to the general public at 7 am (buildings at 8 am), but ARCI members who are willing to help direct traffic for parking – we will need help keeping ARCI Swap Row open for members – can enter at 6 a.m. providing you have an advance ticket and can show positive ARCI ID (your current membership card). You can then pick out your favorite flea market parking space and lend a hand for a few minutes when the gates open at 7. We could also use some help Saturday afternoon after 2 pm setting up signs, the PA system, tables, etc.




## RADIOFEST HOTEL — NEW LOCATION

# **NEW ARCI CALL LETTERS**

# FCC ISSUES WA9RCI VANITY HAM CALL TO ARCI

ARCI's long-awaited vanity ham radio club call letters, WA9RCI, were issued May 17, replacing the KC9IPB club call which we held for the past ten years. The change of call letters had been discussed for some time, and our late trustee, Bill Ross, W9WR, had intended to pursue the matter before his passing. Ron Grams, WB9IMR, had agreed to take over the trusteeship of the license, and following discussion and approval by the membership at our April meeting, the vanity call request was filed and subsequently approved by the FCC and issued at no charge to the club (FCC had been charging a fee for these calls until recently, when they decided that it was counterproductive to do so!).

This clears the way for use of our new call, reflecting the club's A-R-C-I initials, for our ham station at *Radiofest*. An Amateur Radio station, using vintage equipment, has been a *Radiofest* tradition going back to the Elgin days during the 1990s when Harry Blesy, N9CQX, set up ham gear at the event for a number of years. In 2005, ARCI applied to the FCC for a Club Station license and received the KC9IPB call, and various members, including Chris Farley, KC9IEQ, Ed Schumacher, WA9GQK, and Jim Novak, WA9FIH, supplied most of the equipment that we used. The mailing address listed on the license is Jim's, who has agreed to continue handling requests for QSL (verification) cards from hams contacting our station.

# **NEWS FROM THE HAMSHACK**

## NATIONAL RADIO'S VHF RECEIVERS

The National Radio Company in Malden, Massachusetts actually began as a toy company in the early 1900s, but by the 1920s was producing capacitors and other components for other manufacturers including Browning & Drake, and in the early 1930s began selling their own SW-2 regenerative shortwave receivers, followed by the SW-3, -4, and -5. James Millen, W1HRX, joined the company in 1927 and remained until 1939. National went on to manufacture quality equipment for the CAA (predecessor to the FAA) and other governmental agencies, and produced many components and receivers, including the famed HRO series, for our military during WWII. Following the war, the company continued producing communications equipment under government contracts, but also marketed general coverage and ham band receivers, as well as a series of SSB transceivers for the Amateur Radio community, including the NCX-3, NCX-5, NCX-200, NCX-500, and NCX-1000. The company became insolvent in the late 1980s, and its assets were liquidated in a bankruptcy proceeding in 1991. This article will focus on their VHF receivers.

The first receiver National produced that covered frequencies above 10 Meters was the SRR (Super Regenerative Receiver) which somewhat resembled the SW-3, and came

with a plug in coil covering the ham 5 Meter band – 56 to 60 Mc. (NOTE: Amateur prewar VHF bands were 5 and 2-1/2 Meters, which became 6 and 2 Meters in a realignment of frequency allocations after the war). Optional coil sets were available for the SRR that provided coverage for 80, 40, 20 and 10 Meters.

National's first real VHF receiver was the 1-10, with general coverage from 27 to 250 Mc in 6 bands. A super-regenerative



design, it was capable of CW, AM and FM reception, and National Matter Media SPW vernier dial with hand calibrated tuning charts. Type 954 and 955 acom tubes were used in the RF and detector stages, and two octal based tubes provided audio amplification. An external 5886 "doghouse" AC power supply was required, or the set could be run on battery power. The 1-10 and its successor, the 1-10A, with different audio tubes and a redesigned front panel, were produced from about 1938 through 1949. They had a selling price in 1938 of \$85, equivalent to about \$1442 in 2016 dollars! The 1-10 series used a pair of binding posts for balanced line lead in connecting to a dipole antenna cut to frequency of choice. The early 1-10 had its binding posts on top of the radio, whereas the 1-10A's binding posts protruded from the right side.

Acorn tubes, by the way, got their name by their shape. They were physically small and without traditional bases, with pins extending radially. Depending on design, some had a pin coming out of the top and/or bottom. They plugged into flat, ring shaped low-loss ceramic sockets, and their design provided the shortest possible paths for RF, minimizing excessive stray inductance and capacitance, so important in the design of VHF equipment.



The 1-10 series was succeeded in 1949 by the HFS receiver/converter, a super-regenerative superhet design that could be used as a stand-alone radio, or provided 10.7 Mc output to feed into an HF communications receiver resulting in dual conversion if greater image rejection and selectivity was desired. The HFS also used a PW tuning dial with calibrated tuning charts, and six plug in coil sets that could be stored in a rack under the radio's hinged top cover. It also had a built in speaker. Like its predecessor, it required an external power source such as the Model 5886. By the time the HFS was designed, seven pin miniature tubes were available, and a 6AK5 was used in the front end as a converter (First Detector, as it was called then). One other miniature tube, a 9002 HF Oscillator, was used. The remainder of the seven tube circuit was comprised of octal based tubes

The HFS, which was available until about 1952, sold for \$125 plus \$22 for the power supply, and provided continuous coverage from 27 to 250 Mc. Other options included a 686S 6 Volt DC Vibrator power supply for mobile or battery use, and a TB-1 tilt base.
