





ARCI EMail Services

In the interest of sharing and promoting vintage radio, ARCI provides two email services, one for announcements and one for enthusiast interaction.

Announcements

The ARCI announcement service has been active for several years. It is used to communicate club business and information from the general public. Examples: Swap meet notifications, items for sale by a member of the general public, and professional radio auction announcements.

These emails are from: "Antique Radio Club of Illinois <clubinfo@antique-radios.org>". The service used is Mailchimp. To join, send a request to: clubinfo@antique-radios.org. You can opt-out at any time via the link at the bottom of each message. There are currently 781 subscribers.

Enthusiast Interaction

Introduced in December of 2022, this email service provides a forum for the sharing of radio related topics. Typical topics are: share your projects, share radio history, place an ad to buy or sell, and make requests for help. Messages are archived and viewable on the web in addition to email delivery.

These emails have the prefix: "[ARCI radio club]" in the subject line. Google Groups is the platform. To join, send a request to: <u>clubinfo@antique-radios.org</u>. You can opt-out any time via the link at the bottom of each message. There are currently 655 subscribers.

There are three ways to receive messages from ARCI radio club google group They are user selectable via personal account:

- 2. Digest (bundled) email messages

Be sure to reserve the dates of August 4th and 5th. Building on the tremendous success of *Radiofest* 2022, we are enthusiastically putting together a two-day schedule of events that we all look forward to at *Radiofest*. August 4th and 5th is around the corner ... so be sure to pre-register now for bargain-priced selling spaces and banquet tickets.

LOCATION: We will return to the spacious and beautifully maintained **Medinah Shriners in Addison, Illinois**. This modern, upscale facility is across from a **Hilton Garden Inn**. The Medinah Shriners is located at the junction of I-355 and Army Trail Road in Addison, Illinois. This is a very convenient location that can be accessed from all directions within the entire Chicago area.

HOTEL: Our official hotel for *Radiofest* 2023 is the Hilton Garden Inn, located directly adjacent to the Medinah Shriners complex, and is a very short walk from the banquet facilities and parking lots. Medinah Shriners and Hilton Garden Inn are completely independent entities, but they coordinate closely on events. Once again, the hotel has set aside a block of rooms for Radiofest 2023 attendees of \$109 per night. This is a really nice hotel at a great price. You will not be disappointed! EVENTS SCHEDULE

You can participate in our world-class auction on Friday night and experience the always-anticipated giant open-air swap meet on Saturday. Also on Saturday is the popular donation sale/auction, educational presentation and a special all day program featuring **Old Time Radio programming** in the Shriners lobby. Sellers can participate in the Sellers Raffle with the evening Banquet closing out the event. **Refer to the specific event details found elsewhere in this ARCI NEWS.**

STREAMLINED REGISTRATION PROCESS

ARCI is, again, offering a streamlined registration processes to best utilize our existing club resources. We have established on-line registration with price incentives for registration and parking spaces compared to the familiar mail-in procedure. Mail-in registration, however, is still an option, if desired. Sellers' parking spots will, again, be on a "first-come-first-served" basis rather than assigning individual spaces. A "Registration Form" can be found in another section of this issue showing price details and registration instructions or on-line at https://tinyurl.com/Radiofest-2023

Note: Online pre-registration is instantaneous, but if you decide to use "snail mail", your envelope must be postmarked by July 14, 2023 or July 28, 2023 if registering on-line. On site day of swap meet fees are higher.

OUTDOOR SWAP AREA

The swap meet will again be located in its own large parking lot at the west end of the facility. There will be plenty of seller spaces available with lots of room between rows for maneuvering a small truck or a vehicle with a trailer. The sellers' lot is also totally out of the main traffic flow, which is good for those walking around the swap meet. Parking in this lot will be available only to sellers and attendees who have already purchased selling spaces or will do so on site. All sellers are required to check in at the registration area. Directly adjacent to the sellers' lot is the main parking lot, with plenty of spaces available for buyers and visitors. It is an easy walk from one lot to the other.

IMPORTANT! NO TENT STAKES ARE ALLOWED IN THE SWAP MEET LOT.

Our agreement with the Medinah Shriners strongly stipulates that no tent stakes will be used in the swap meet lot. This rule will be strictly enforced by ARCI.

NO ELECTRONICS DISPOSAL...Radiofest attendees cannot dispose of electronics on site. The Illinois EPA has substantially tightened the rules regarding disposal of electronics items in state landfills. We are required to keep regular trash and electronic waste separate at the meet. This means no electronics may be placed in our trash containers. We therefore ask for your cooperation on the following: Do not use our area at Radiofest for any electronics you simply intend to throw away. We cannot accommodate such items and they should not be brought to Radiofest. Items to be placed in our donation auction should have a reasonable possibility of being useful to another collector. In other words, please exercise discretion when placing items in the auction pile. If you do not believe anyone will really want it, then please do not put it in the auction. We will be monitoring the donation auction area carefully, and ARCI does reserve the right to reject any item that we do not deem acceptable for the donation auction. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in this important matter.

RESTROOM FACILITIES

Outside restroom facilities will be provided, conveniently located near the middle of the parking lot along the West side of the seller's lot. Indoor restroom facilities will also be available through the front entrance to the Shriners building.

TRASH CONTAINERS

Trash receptacles for general refuse will be provided in the parking area. Please do not place any electrical items these receptacles.

FOOD ITEMS FOR PURCHASE

The Shriners plan on providing a variety of food items for purchase at reasonable prices on Saturday. The Hotel will also serve food throughout most of the course of the event. Logistics prohibit ARCI from providing free drinks or snacks at our fest. However, it can get hot outside, so you may want pack drinks and snacks for yourself and bring them with you to the swap meet.

AUCTION: The opening night auction will be in the Medinah Crescent Ballroom. The large quantity and excellent quality of items available in the auction make this a "must attend" event. You never know what you will find here, including rare and highly collectible items. Jim Sargent from VRPS is returning as auctioneer. See the excellent article on Auction Information and Rules by John Stone elsewhere in this issue.

DONATIONS: The usual donation auction will be held at noon (12pm) on Saturday. Keep in mind that you may purchase donated items throughout the day (beginning at 9am) without having to wait for the actual donation auction. Either way, your purchase will likely be a bargain!

BANQUET: Banquet tickets are priced at \$40 per person and are available by pre-registration only. The food is always superb and it is a great way to close out *Radiofest* with your friends. **Note: Tickets must be purchased by July 14, 2023 by mail or July 28, 2023 on-line.** *Please see the separate page in this issue for banquet details.*

EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATIONS: Two great programs are scheduled for Saturday. Vintage audio and radio enthusiast Pete Nauseda returns this year with what promises to be an informative program at 1pm on "Myths and Facts in Audio and Radio Restoration" in the MUSIC ROOM. A special treat for *Radiofest* attendees will be listening to Old Time Radio programming throughout the day in the SHRINERS LOBBY brought to you by Radio Host Paul Iverson. *Please see the separate pages in this issue for the presentation details*.

ARCI RADIOFEST 2023 MAIN AUCTION

Friday Night, August 4th

Thanks to John Stone, ARCI Auction Coordinator, for submitting the following auction planning update.

We are pleased to announce that the ARCI Main Auction will again return as the opening event for *Radiofest* 2023. It will be held in the Crescent Ballroom of the Medinah Shriners facility, with an official starting time of 6 PM. Seller registration will open no later than 3:00 pm and close at 5:30 pm, or when we have reached the maximum of 260 registered lots, whichever comes first. As in previous years we anticipate a very busy and well attended event, and we suggest you allow as much time as possible to register and place your items. Sellers will be able to unload their items through the front entrance of the Medinah facility. The Crescent Ballroom is easily accessible from the front entrance, but we strongly suggest you bring your own hand truck or rolling cart with you, if you are bringing heavy or oversized items. Ample parking for buyers and sellers will be available in the lot directly in front of the facility.

The ARCI auction is a unique event, made possible through the joint efforts of generous volunteers from 5 different radio clubs around the country. We are once again privileged to have Jim Sargent, professional auctioneer and president of VPRS in Irving, TX, to call our auction. Jim's unique skills as an expert auctioneer, along with his in-depth knowledge of vintage radios and audio equipment will make for an enjoyable and exciting evening. Backing up Jim's efforts will be Nicholas Tillich, president of the Wisconsin Antique Radio Club. Nick and his crew will handle the critical job of registering all items up for auctions, and then updating and tracking their status throughout the auction process.

Fees are unchanged from the previous auction, and are as follows: \$7 per item for sellers (\$10 for non-members), bidding cards at \$3 each (\$5 for non-members) and a 10% buyer's premium applies. There is an 8 lot limit per seller, along with a total auction lot limit of 260, to keep the auction from running more than 4 hours. Registration will close either at 5:30 PM or when the maximum limit has been reached, whichever comes first.

Food and beverage service (alcoholic and non-alcoholic) is once again planned to be available throughout the duration of the auction, with cash and credit cards accepted.

Auction Rules



- Official auction registration hours: 3:00 PM to 5:30 PM, or when the total number of registered lots reaches 260, whichever comes first.
- Auction begins at 6:00 PM.
- 8 lots maximum per registered seller.
- Auction fees: \$7 per item for sellers (\$10 for non-members); bidding cards at \$3 each (\$5 for non-members); 10% buyer's premium applies.
- Vintage Radio, Audio, Ham Radio, Phonograph, and items related to these categories only. (Advertising, parts, etc.) No new items allowed. No fans, clocks, or other small appliances, except those clearly intended for the purpose of marketing the items listed above. ARCI reserves the right to refuse any item presented at auction registration that does not meet the listed criteria.
- Cash or personal check only for all auction purchases and fees.
- Please hold unnecessary conversation to a minimum while the auction is in progress.
- Please do not bring personal food or alcoholic beverages into the ballroom during the course of the auction.

RADIOFEST 2023 Logistics

The ARCI club officers and volunteers look forward to your participation in our premier club event. We hope that you have a truly memorable experience. The Medinah Shriners have provided us with a spacious and beautifully maintained facility for holding our event. The Hilton Garden inn is conveniently located on the same campus. You can walk right from your hotel room to the festivities. Your ARCI *Radiofest* volunteers have worked closely with the Shriners to provide you with the most pleasant and enjoyable *Radiofest* experience possible. Please read through the information below and follow the guidelines closely. Your cooperation is important, and always greatly appreciated.

The seller's parking lot is located on the far west side of the Shriners facility, directly adjacent to Swift Road. Parking in this lot will be available only to sellers and attendees who have already purchased selling spaces or will do so on site. The parking lot located directly in front of the facility and directly adjacent to the seller's lot will have ample parking spaces for *Radiofest* attendees. After you enter the Shriners complex from Swift Road onto Hilton Drive, you will take the first left to gain access to the seller's lot, which will be on your left. *There are three entrances into the lot, but only the middle entrance will be open for access to the lot during registration.* The registration area will be located immediately on your right as you pull into the middle entrance. All sellers are required to check in at the registration area to pick up name tags, tickets and *Radiofest* handouts prior to parking.

IMPORTANT! NO TENT STAKES ARE ALLOWED IN THE SWAP MEET LOT

Outside restroom facilities will be provided, conveniently located near the middle of the parking lot along the West side of the seller's lot. Indoor restroom facilities will also be available through the front entrance to the Shriners building. You will find the inside restrooms located directly across from the ballroom, on the left side of the lobby.



Transistor Radio Clones From A to Z

by Norm Smith

The transistor radio was a new and exciting product when it was released in the mid 1950's. With the emergence of Top 40 radio playing "Rock & Roll and the "Baby Boom" generation, the new lightweight portable radio became an instant sensation. Many radio manufacturers joined the fray to get a piece of the action in these early, high profit sales.

One company that really led the way for great engineering and design was the Zenith Radio Corporation. As a result of their success, it was not very long before radios from many other manufacturers appeared on the market. This is an overview of many radios which in some way did emulate the Zenith designs.

We will cover several highly successful Zenith models and some of the more obvious attempts to market a radio which might ride on the coat tails of that sales success.

The first model is the Zenith Royal 50. This shirt pocket radio had very good sales and it was not long before "look alike" radios appeared. The most commonly seen is the model TS10 which was marketed by large department and music stores. Each store used it's own trade name for this set. Names such as Jewel, Grinnels, Hudson, Ambassador, Majestic, and others were used. As you can see in the photos, the styling of the TS10 is a hybridization of the Zenith Royal 50 and the RCA model 3 RH21. The front closely resembles the RCA and the rest of the cabinet design is a direct take of the Zenith design. The circuitry inside bore no resemblance to the Zenith or the RCA.

The Zenith Royal 50's success led to many clones

- Clones had higher transistor count but poorer performance
- A "TS10" design was used in many clones
- Some of the clone brands: Jewel, Grinnels, Hudson, Ambassador, Majestic


Zenith Royal 500 and a variety of clones from other manufacturers

One of the most copied of all transistor radios was the Zenith Royal 500. This very successful radio set the standard by which many other radios were compared. It was not long before there were a great variety of similarly styled radios on the market. Some were obvious direct copies and some varied just enough to avoid patent infringement problems. One very rare model was the Webster which is shown in these photos below. It was made in England and never put in to mass production.

Widely distributed Royal 500 clones from the same marketing groups that copied the Royal 50 quickly began to show up in the same large department and jewelry stores. These radios were the same exact dimensions and even copied the internal circuitry right down to the placement of components on the circuit board. The cabinet styling even included the exact dial and volume script. These photos show

that and also many variations of names and cabinet variations.

Similar looking Webster - Not the same inside and in performance

- Entirely different chassis design and of inferior quality
- Primitive chassis not very durable
- 6 transistor, poor performing, never marketed in the U.S.



What is considered to be the best lightweight transistor radio ever, was the Zenith Royal 500H. These were released in the summer of 1961.












The Zenith "Transoceanic" was the large multi-band receiver and several very similarly styled radios from other manufacturers soon appeared on the market. The Zenith "Royal 1000" was soon followed by Admiral's "All World" model 909. When Zenith added FM reception on their "Royal 3000", Admiral countered with the model 1009. Another very close copy was the Heathkit model GR43. From the outside it looked almost identical to the Zenith "Royal 3000". The electronics had no similarity to the Zenith design.

The next generation of the "Transoceanic" was the Royal 7000. This radio was copied by Sony Corporation with their "Earth Orbiter" model CRF 5090. There were also several "Transoceanic" type radios from other foreign sources such as Realtone, JVC, Juliette, Philips and Lloyd's.
